

## **LFCC member projects**

The next meeting of LFCC to be held on 9<sup>th</sup> February 2023 will be used to help LFCC members to identify and develop ideas for projects relating to habitat improvement projects. Members are encouraged to bring their project ideas along to the meeting where we will try to develop the ideas and suggest how they can be funded.

Points to keep in mind:

Projects must have full permissions in place, including landowner permission and, where necessary, EA permits such as the FRAP before funding will be given. It is the responsibility of the member applying for funds to ensure this is done. LFCC takes no responsibility for works carried out without the necessary permits nor does it accept liability for any projects carried out. Please make sure you have all necessary insurance in place.

### **Proposal outline**

If you want to send a proposal in advance for advice or comment please feel free to do so. The proposal should include key details to include at least the exact location where the works will be carried out (name, grid reference or e.g. What3Words), what is planned, whether the landowner has been approached for approval, what materials are required, what plant hire is needed, etc. Do include the contribution in kind from club members for labour and so on. Projects will be assessed based on their practicality considering the resources available and their likely impact in solving the identified problem.
